Congress theme and Scientific Programme

Bali is known as The Island of Gods, and renowned as a great source of spirituality and inspiration. This spirituality inspired the theme and sub-themes for the Bali Congress, which will ensure relevant programmes are developed for our discussions on the future of globalmidwifery:

- o Midwives **protect** the future through up to date competencies
- o Midwives **invest** in the future through women and family centred quality care
- o Midwives **advocate** for the future through effective empowerment
- o Midwives **secure** the future through strong regulatory mechanisms

Council policy development alongside the outcome of sub-themes for the abstract papers, which will follow-on, are likely to have a major impact on the future requirements for childbearing women and their newborns globally.

Over the next 18 months the ICM board and a highly skilled international group of midwives from the Scientific Professional Programme Committee (SPPC) will start developing a programme that is topical, stimulating and varied to suit midwives from all backgrounds and experiences.

The congress will offer a unique platform to tackle a wide range of activities including: traditional peer-reviewed papers, work-in-progress discussion sessions, and workshops on innovative projects, and it will focus on collaboration with international partners and draw inspiration from outstanding keynote speakers.

Bali - The Island of Gods

Bali is commonly referred to as The Island Of Thousands Temples, The Island of Gods, and Bali Dwipa.

The mere thought of Bali evokes thoughts of a paradise. More than a place, it's a mood, an aspiration, a state-of-mind. The rich and diverse culture of Bali plays out at all levels of life, from the exquisite flower-petal offerings placed everywhere, to the processions of joyfully garbed locals, shutting down major roads as they march to one of the myriad temple ceremonies, to the other-worldly traditional music and dance performed island-wide.



Bali enjoys a subtropical climate with an average temperature in June between 27C (80F) and 31C.

The official currency is the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR/Rp) with Exchange offices and ATM machines available throughout the Island and at Ngurah Rai International Airport.

The official language in Bali is Indonesian, but English is well spoken in most touristic areas.

Visa requirements

All visitors to Indonesia are required to possess a valid passport with an expiration date at least 6 months after the date of entry into the territory of Indonesia. Passports must contain at least two blank visa pages.

The "amendment" and "endorsement" pages at the back of the passport do not generally count as blank pages and cannot be used for visa and stamp for entry permit purposes.

Depending on your passport there are three options to enter Indonesia that apply to most travellers that come for tourist or social purposes only:

- 1. No Visa required** (majority of countries)
- FREE entry, 30 days valid, NOT extendable
- 2. Visa on Arrival**
- currently 35US\$, 30 days valid, extendable (once for 30 days)
- 3. Visa needed** (apply abroad before arriving in Indonesia)

Please check with your embassy to see what visa regulations for Bali Indonesia apply to you.

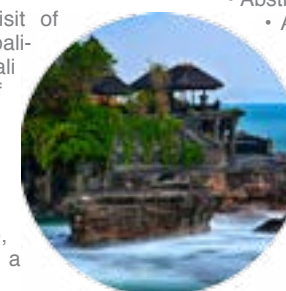
Ubud Tour

Visit ubud village in one day. This one day tour will include a Barong Dance performance, Visit Celuk Village for silver art, Batu an village for Painting art, Batuan Temple, Tegallalang Rice Terrace, Ubud Monkey Forest, Ubud Royal Palace and Ubud Market.

Uluwatu Tour

This one day tour includes the visit of Uluwatu Temple, the most famous balinese temple in the south part of Bali with a breathtaking sunset view of the rock cliff temple facing the Indian ocean.
